## **Los Peñasquitos Lagoon Enhancement Plan Update – Workshop III**

Torrey Pines Association and Los Peñasquitos Lagoon Foundation invite you to participate in the third of a series of workshops designed to solicit input and support as we update the 1985 Los Peñasquitos Lagoon Enhancement Plan and Program.

The first workshop, held in October, focused on project goals and objectives to determine whether they were comprehensive in meeting key values of individual participants and stakeholder groups. Working together in breakout groups, participants reviewed, assessed, and modified a draft set of project goals and objectives developed to guide the evaluation of alternatives for lagoon restoration and management.

The second workshop, held in November, focused on assessing opportunities and constraints for project goals and objectives refined during the first workshop by Breakout Group 1 - *Habitat*. Based upon dominant habitat type and hydrology, the Lagoon was divided into four primary management zones: 1) Nearshore/Inlet; 2) Tidal Salt Marsh; 3) Transitional and 4) Riparian/Upland. Working together in a group, participants considered, discussed and evaluated habitat-based goals and objectives as they related to one or more of the four management zones, as well as potential approaches to support them.
